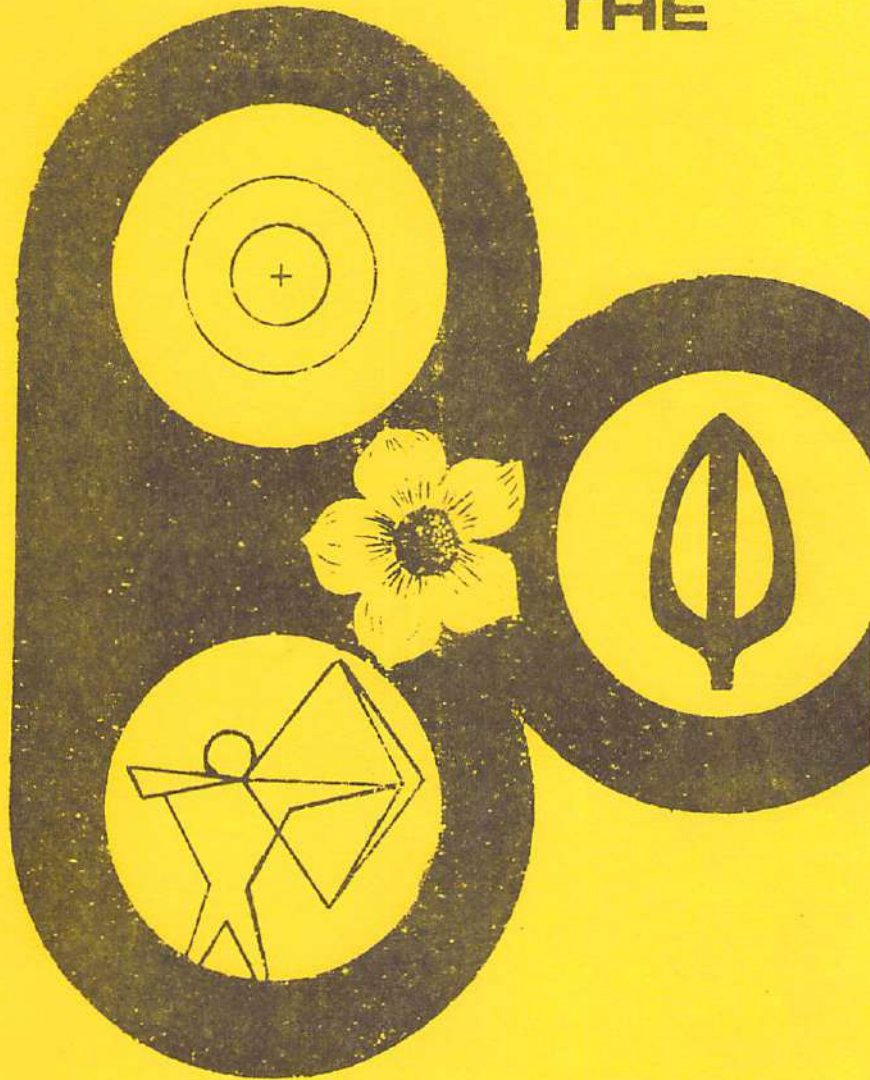

A directors Meeting of the BC Archery Association was held on Saturday night September 11, 1976 at the shop of Ron Boorman, 39-8th Street New Westminster B.C.

The Meeting was called to order by the President Dave Webb at 20:20.

The Directors in attendance were: Dave Webb, Mike Bodnor, Dave Ball, John Soper, Odd Yttri, Jim Wiebe, Marg Saunders, Andy Woo, Hank Wiseman, Ron Boorman, Rob Sanderson, Don Warren.

The minutes of the last directors meeting and the A.G.M. Minutes were read by Michele Soper, Secretary for the BCAA. Moved by Dave Ball and seconded by Rob Sanderson that the minutes be adopted as read. MOTION CARRIED.

Letter from Doug Wood in regard of Bowhunting awards.

CLINICS - Hank Wiseman

H. Wiseman read his report which is enclosed.

H. Wiseman also mentioned that he attended a course in matter to be able to give better advise in his teaching, but at that course a great deal was not concerning archery. He trained 5 monitors and charge them \$ 5.00 a piece, he spent with them 4 hours of intensive training and all 5 received their certificates. Hank also requested 25 rubbands for instructors.

There will be a clinic in Dawson Creek, Hank Wiseman suggested November 20 and 21, 1976. Pete Muir and himself will be going as well as our President Dave Webb. The request was to include a demonstration, as well as starting a new club. The correspondance course is going great, at the present their are 6 persons following the instructors course and/or coaches course. Jim Wiebe has completed his instructor's course and T. McDowell is just about finished his coach's course. The minimum age required to be an Instructor is 16 Years.

NEW BUSINESS CONT

Dave Ball made a motion that the B.C.A.A. award a grand aggregate medal only in each categories, John Soper seconded, MOTION CARRIED.

Rob Sanderson moved that the B.C. PROFESSIONALS are asked to organise a demonstration team for the promotion of Archery, seconded by Mike Bodnor MOTION CARRIED.

2. As many scores as possible are to be submitted during the month of January. (minimum of 8). An average will be taken that will place the archer within the following groups for the shoot-offs in February so the archer will then compete only within his own average group regardless of equipment used.
3. Average groups :

under 150	240 to 249
150 to 179	250 to 259
180 to 199	260 to 269
200 to 219	270 to 279
220 to 239	280 to 300
4. Two witnessed scores are to be turned in each week in February for a total of 8 scores.
5. There will be no equipment categories, but one must use the same type of equipment throughout the tournament.
6. One score shall consist of 30 arrows (10 ends of 3 for a possible 300) shot at 18 meters on the 40 cm. 10 ring target face.
7. All professionals shall compete in the same category. *
8. The team event (one man, one woman, one junior) shall be one category, however, the individual's scores will also be recognized in the average groups. *
9. In awarding medals, we will recognize:
 - a. Individual high scores (everyone will receive this).
 - b. Top average and top individual score in each average group for the following categories:
 - i. Adult
 - ii. Junior
 - iii. Professional *
 - iv. Teams (from same club) *
 - c. Professionals will also receive 50% of Pro entry fee back in cash prizes. (to top average - 30% to top individual score - 20%)

THE OLYMPICS BY WANDA ALLAN

Going to the Olympics was the greatest experience I've ever had. I met a lot of new friends and a lot of the old ones. I saw and spoke to some of the well known athletes of Canada

I heard stories saying that we were cramed into rooms, well there were twelve girls in my room. It had two bedrooms, one with two beds, the other had four, and a large room with six beds. One bathroom and a kitchen with three sinks. We had lots of room, since the only time all the girls were in the same room was at night.

The food was out of this world, it was great, just about anything you wanted and lots of it. You could eat any time of the day or night, there always a cafeteria open. Here is a sample menu for Dinner: Each day was different.

Across the road from the village was the International building There was a room for every sport in which you could obtain the latest news. There were different shops there. The cinema had a different movie showing every night. Two discotheques, one a little more formal than the other, where we danced. Drugstore, newstand, laundry, drycleaners, hairdressers, bookstore billiard room made up some of the shops

Outside there were tables and chairs, music played or a show of some kind. You could get beer or coffee there. The outdoor theater had live musical groups playing, one special guest was Gordon Lightfoot.

There were also tennis courts, minigolf, horseshoes, a swimminr pool, croquet, and volleyball. A number of tours to different parts of Montreal and suburbs, Ottawa, Quebec City And Niagara Falls. If you didn't want to do any of this you could sit and watch T.V. or sleep.

The stadium wasn't far from the village and it was super great, though it wasn't finished. The opening ceremonies were super, I've never seen so many people. The noise, I couldnt hear my self think. When I entered the stadium all I could do was look up at the people. I didn't even know were I went. I didn't get a good look at the Queen, but knew she was wearing a pink dress. Being in the opening ceremonies was fantastic, but you miss a lot.

Olympics continued

It was fun just walking around the village and seeing the different people. There was one place where everyone was yelling "change, change. We traded pins etc., you had to watch the Russians, they wanted everything.

The practice field was not far from the village and we could practice at Joliette. Both fields were in great shape and well guarded. One time there was a man fixing his roof, the guards went over and down he came. In Joliette there were guards all over the place, even when we walked down and back from the targets the guards went with us. We were last one time, the guards saw us, we started back slowly, but they didn't think it was funny. Even if we went walking in the woods, we wouldn't see them, then they were there.

The weather was quite warm, one day we shot for awhile, then went swimming. Gordon and Lenard went to the clubhouse for a drink. Dave went up after, the excuse being that he couldn't wait any longer. When Lucille and I tried to leave the guards wouldn't let us, we had to wait for the others. The bus which took us back to the village was supposed to leave at 5:00, it was about quarter to when we left the field. Meanwhile Lucille and I went into the club house with the rest of the team. Meantime the bus had just left!!! Leonard drove us back in the end so we decided to make the best of it and finish our swim.

The next day was Lucille's birthday and after practice in Montreal Leonard drove us back to Joliette in his car. We were going to have a relaxing afternoon and party for Lucille. But we got caught by the press and after 2 hours of them we left but Gordon and Lucille had to stay. The party was planned for 4:00 and it was already 4:00, maybe a little after. Finally she showed up, and boy was she surprised. It was a good party, but again the bus left early at 4:30. This time two guys from Quebec took us back to Montreal with official police escorts.

The official practice day it rained in the afternoon, Lucille and I shot in the morning and watched in the afternoon. We went through the equipment inspection and they didn't like the way the Canadians were dressed. We weren't all in white the coach and Manager were in track suits, but oh well so were a lot of the other teams.

Mrs. Eith was sure uptight about having everything white, including our t-shirts with our country's name on them.

The first day of the Olympics came and Lucille and I went down for breakfast, we sat and looked at it. Luanne Ryan came and joined us and she felt the same. I thought the trials were bad but this I couldn't even look through my binoculars, I was shaking too much. After I shot my 294 at 70 I wouldn't do anything except sit. After that day was over I felt a little better and so did Lucille. As the days went on I went slowly down and Lucille went up. In the end I was 16th and you know the rest.

The last day we had a great party, it was all over!!!

The only thing wrong it being over is having to say goodbye to all the others.

The next morning we saw Luann Ryan she had her medal, it was real heavy, with a chain. She had just about worn out the back of her neck showing it off. I went with Lucille back to her place and we watched the closing ceremonies on T.V. You see a lot more that way.

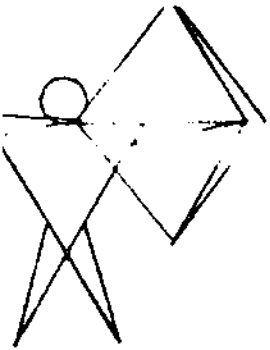

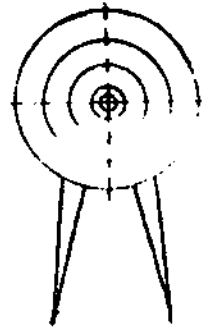
