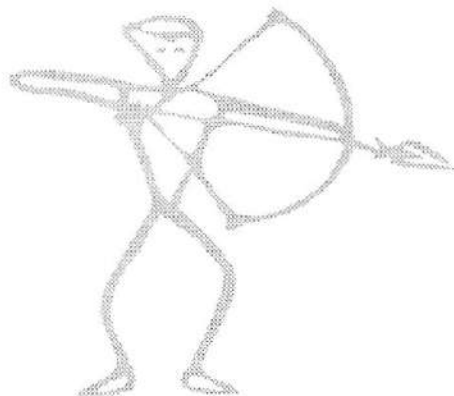


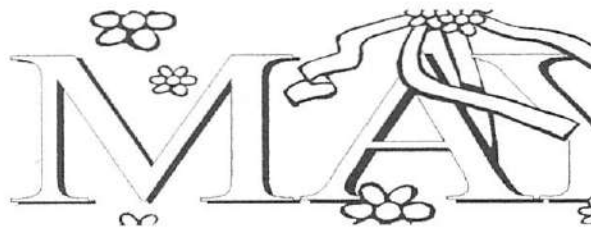

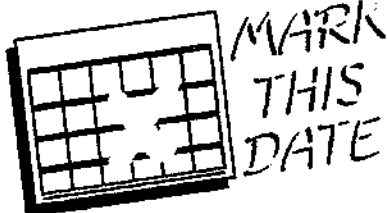

YOU AND THE RULES

Some of the case studies illustrated in this column are taken from Don Lovo's International Judge Newsletter. Other situations originate from events occurring in Canadian tournaments. Please consider these studies and respond with your opinion. Have you ever encountered a similar problem? Whether an archer or a Judge, your comments will help to make Judging more consistent within our province.

DIRECTOR OF SHOOTING

We see a lot written about Judges interacting with archers, but virtually nothing about the job of the Director of Shooting. At our own local tournaments, we often have a parent helping out. At provincial events, the Judges usually trade off. At major events, we tend to place a highly qualified Judge in that position because we recognize the importance of the job. The more I look at this position, the more importance I place on it. The rules state:

2.5.1 The Organizers shall appoint a Director of Shooting who, whenever possible, shall be a Judge. The DoS shall not participate in the shooting and the duties shall include:

- instituting and enforcing any reasonable safety measures he considers necessary;
- controlling the shooting, regulating the timing of the ends, and the order in which the competitors will occupy the shooting line;
- exercising control over the use of loudspeakers, the activities of photographers, etc., so that competitors are not disturbed;
- ensuring that spectators remain behind the barriers enclosing the shooting range.
- Assistants may be appointed as necessary at the discretion of the organizers to assist the Director of Shooting.
- The DoS also ensures that no arrows are left in the targets, and deals with late arrivals.

You are the Director of Shooting. Archers are shooting 6 arrows in a 4 minute time frame. You are using a combination of flags and whistles to control the line (no electronic lights).

Archers are currently shooting on the green flag. You are temporarily distracted by some event and, when you look at your timing clock again, you notice that the current time is 3 minutes 45 seconds. You immediately put out the yellow flag.

Some archers still have arrows to shoot and they have seen you change the flag to yellow. They are not hurrying though because the flag has just been put out and they believe there is approximately 30 seconds remaining.

There are now 5 seconds remaining in the original 4 minutes. What should you do.

IN MY OPINION

Some choices to consider:

- stop all shooting at the 4 minute mark.

Reference.- 2.3.3 (e) Four minutes SHALL be the time allowed for a competitor to shoot an end of six arrows.

- allow 30 seconds to pass since you placed the yellow flag out.

Reference 2.3.3 (g) A visual warning SHALL be given 30 seconds (1/2 minute) before the expiration of the time limit .

If you chose to strictly enforce the

4 minute rule, what options are possible if you wish to reconsider?

- stick with your ruling.

Refer complaints to rule 2.3.3 above

- allow extra time to make up the arrow referring to rules 2.5.8 and 2.3.9

Reference 2.3.9 If the shooting is suspended during an end for any reason the time limit SHALL be adjusted; forty seconds per arrow will be given.

Reference 2.5.8 The Director of Shooting, in consultation with the Judges, has the authority to extend the time limit in exceptional circumstances. When visual time controls are in use, the 30 second remains unchanged.

• What if the Director of Shooting was 5 seconds off in putting up the yellow flag?

- What if several archers had only shot one arrow?

The DoS is often a great distance from the archers. The job is to deal with the timing. It's the Judge's job to deal with the archers. Working with flags is never as precise as working with electronic timing. While I do think the 4 minutes should take precedence, it is a judgment call. However, perhaps it's safer to make the call, and leave it up to the archer to follow the normal appeal procedure.

What do you think? Your opinion may help to build guidelines for future archery events.

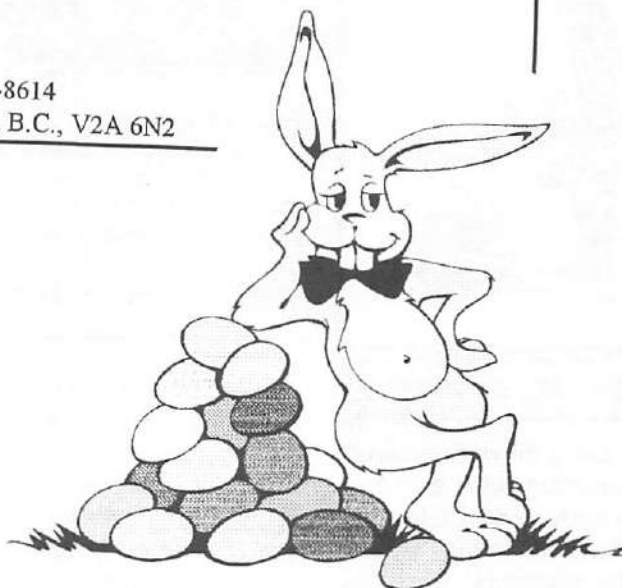

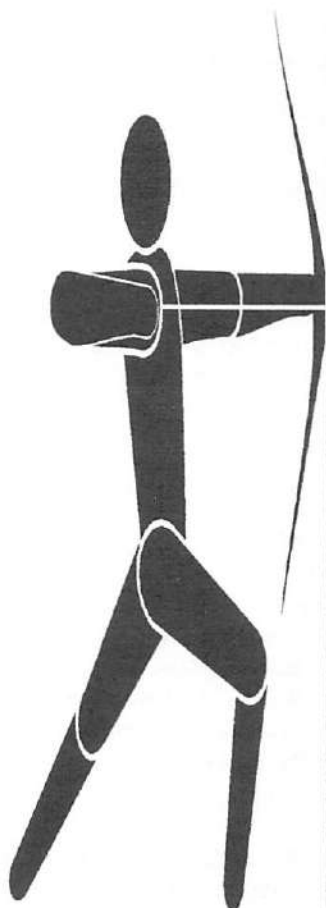

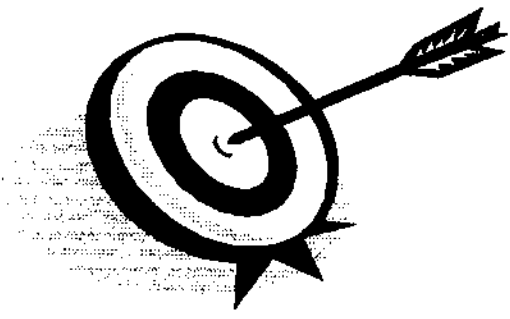

The Zone Directors are elected in a mail vote (mailed to the BCAA Secretary) after nominations are solicited through the newsletter. The term of office is two years. The Zone Directors are directly responsible to you, the members.

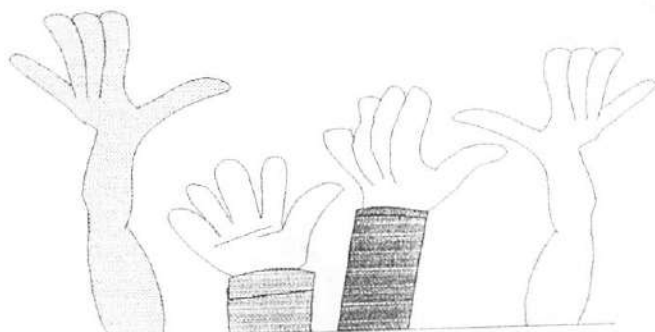
The Bowhunting Vice President will be elected by the membership at the AGM. This executive member is in charge of monitoring the bowhunting activities in the province. He oversees the IBEP program and deals with the Provincial Government on all bowhunting issues.

The President will be elected at the Board meeting following the AGM. The President is responsible for chairing Board meetings, developing the government assistance package, and overseeing our participation in multi-games programs, supervises the activities of the staff and the FCA representative.

FROM THE DESK OF SUSAN LEMKE -TEAM SELECTION

Team B. C Selection Criteria for the Nationals Winnipeg 1998

The team selection criteria is reviewed each year by the board of directors of the BCAA. We attempt to establish criteria that is both objective, for the basic selection, and flexible enough to consider external influences such as budget restrictions and considerations for the potential for individual medals and team event. We also consider coachability, team contribution and contributions given to our sport when making the selection.

In order

for scores to be considered for selection an athlete must a member of the BCAA and must declare their intention to be available for the team in writing by May 1 st to be considered for selection.

To select the team to the Nationals, we will use the top two FITA Stars or Canadian Fitas, and one qualifier of which must be shot in the current outdoor season. These FITA's must be registered with the BCAA team selection administrator prior to the event and appropriate paper work sent to Jim Wiebe, they must be judged by qualified Officials and a number of not less than 3. Tournament summary sheets must be sent to the administrator by the tournament director and officiating timing sheets must be sent to the officials chairman. It is, however, the ultimate responsibility of the archer to ensure that his/bcr score is registered A signed copy of the score card will be an acceptable proof of achievement. The candidate must have also participated in at least of field round within the past year for the purpose of experience in the field. The athlete must also be prepared to sign an athletes agreement with the BCAA. Athletes wishing to participate in a category beyond their regulation age category must receive written permission from the Board to be eligible for funding. The selection period starts from Jan 1/98 of the this year to

July 1 st of the current year, this is to allow a couple of extra stars to be considered because of the new criteria for compound shooters this year from the FCA, this new criteria is that the inner ten is no longer required for scoring except in tie breaking.

The qualifying scores for the Nationals will be an average score of 95% of the FCA Canadian Championship record. In making the team selection, we, as a board, will consider funding first, priority to individual categories second and team selection third. Minimum age for the National event is 15 years of age at

the time of the tournament, unless the participant is accompanied by a parent or guardian. If extra funding is available from other sources, beyond our regular grant, specifically for a particular category, it may transcend these

rules of selection. The BCAA will attempt to raise funds to cover the cost of transportation to the championships.

I talked with Gord many times picking Roberta up or stopping by for something from Ma, that is where I learned of his fierce pride in the accomplishments of his family and the undying support of them.

So you didn't see him at the shoots, but every time I see June at the range - I see him, and if you look closely, so will you.

I first met Cec Meehan almost 20 years ago. I'm sure many of you had known him longer. I first met him as an archer.

This large imposing figure came up to me grabbed my bow, pulled it twice and said, "this thing is out of tune." He fiddled with it and then practically dragged me to 55 meters. I had never shot a distance longer than about 25. 55 looked like a mile. "Try this," he said. I did and promptly shot under the butt bending the very first aluminum arrows I had ever bought and had kept for almost 15 years. "You'll get the hang of it," he said and off he went to practice. I didn't know quite how to take him. I was a little intimidated, Cec did that to people.

Cec was truly unique. He worked hard. He surely partied hard. Trips to his Van could do strange things to you. Some of the stories of those parties were indeed true, on some of them ...I was drunk staggering beside him or doing the synchronized diving or whatever silly thing we had decided to do.

Over the years I got to know Cec, and I like to think understand him. His temper was short fused and often renowned. His exterior was sometimes gruff and imposing. His rants and threats were indeed the stuff of legend. "BUT".....

I got to know the real Cec. I got to know the kind caring person inside. I got to see him with a kid who really wanted to learn to shoot. I got to see him with his friends and with Lillian. I got to know a person who loved life and who loved to laugh. I got to know a person that would never ever leave you in the lurch. A person that would do anything for you. A person that always had time to help you out. It usually was Cec that dragged out his tackle box and fixed someone's broken bow at a shoot.

I had the pleasure of working with him, shooting with him, traveling with him, partying with him and of just knowing him.

I am enriched by having known him and I am diminished by the loss of him, as are we all. I am proud to call him friend.

Our thoughts and prayers go out to Lillian and all of Cec's extended family at this tragic time.

We'll miss you friend.

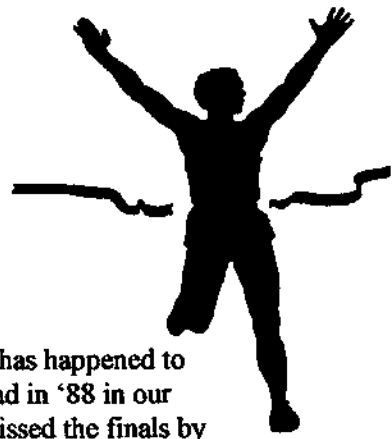

Comments are coming in such as where is the Spirit we had in '88 in our best ever program, '90 when Wade Barnes got sick and short one shooter we missed the finals by only 43 pts. And again in '93 when because Quebec TV wanted to talk with only the french champion did our girls (Diana & Noel) take them both out in the shoot off, in '95 when the boy's cheered on the girls and vice versa and came out with 5 out of 6 inner teams at 70 meters.

According to Mr. Webster:

**TEAM is... a set of persons working TOGETHER in combined,
effort, organized co-operation.**

SPIRIT is ... a persons mental, moral nature or qualities.

Commitment lately has not been as it has in the past. In '88 after a preseason of planning and a busy competitive season, the team sat around a pool and discussed why our goals had fallen short. The commitment and dedication of these athletes was such that the reasons that were brought forward were personally based. Not having the knowledge of periodization and it's implementation that we do now, the plain and simple truth was that our vigorous plans caused us to peak too early. They were so busy working hard for the TEAM and BC that they burnt themselves out.

On March 14, 1998 at 11:00 I sat in a facility with over 300 people to say our last good bye's to a man who, whether or not you agreed or disagreed with him, was the epitome of a TEAM person, *Cecil Lloyd Meehan*.

While sitting in the chapel listening to Jim Breckenridge and Dave Watson give their eulogy the lump in my throat got bigger and bigger. A comment was made by an old time friend that might sum this up quite well was that with Cec's passing "It is the beginning of the end of a special breed of Archer"

"In my opinion" the demise of team spirit comes from within and not from outside. When actions of individuals do their utmost to overpower and be in control of the direction of the group. When "I"s become more important than "we"s. When how "I" look is more important than how I do. When getting the uniform and going for the TEAM dinner supersedes the competition. Istvan Bali said that asking more than 100% is impossible but if you cannot dig down and do the very best that you are capable of then "Kiss the Spirit Goodbye".

In Abbotsford we did have a Team Spirit but this year it was not to be had. I feel it started to go at the test event in Brandon the previous year. It was further added to with the selection process for the Canada Summer Games Team. In hind sight I have my opinions where and why it went wrong. But that is hind sight and it is 20/20.

Cecil I will miss you as a major BC player, fellow archer and friend. As for the TEAM SPIRIT I have my opinions as to how to get it back but it will take a lot more than just a few to get it back to the way it was. My hopes and prayers are that we can regenerate it. I would love to see the administrators, athletes and parents get back on the wagon cause folks "it can be one hell of a ride", just ask those who have been there.

Good bless you Lillian and my prayers are with you.



STRINGS by CLIFF

When I started archery in 1962 we only had B36 Dacron. We had to make a string about $\frac{1}{2}$ " shorter than needed, then hope it did not stretch to long. The B50 Dacron will not do this. Dacron stretches every time you put on your bow and goes back when off. Compounds it will do the same. In competition do not unstring your bow until finished.

The newer materials only stretch a little. Some "creep", that is they stretch very little each time you use it. Check your brace height after every distance.

Dacron must have strands for the bow weight. The newer types you can "tune" the string for better groups. Less strands the more distance you will get, but you may open the arrow group. The number of twists may also affect your grouping. Dacron, 10 to 20 twists, more it may break. Fastflight up to 80 twist, it will not break. I like 40 to 50 twist, it shoots quiet.

If you would like me to make your strings or soft cables, I need to know;
The length, The number of strands, Nock size for center serving, The colour.

Dacron - black, white, red, blue, teal, olive and yellow
Fast Flight - black, white, red, blue, teal, brown, purple, yellow, green and pink
Nylon serving - black, white, red, blue, green and yellow
Fastflight serving - black, white, red, blue, teal, brown, purple, yellow, green and pink
S-4 - black only

Center serving, monofilament (or braided fastflight, add \$1.00) (soon, BYC poygrip braided serving add \$1.00)

Twist strings - I can make two or three colours (three colours strands - 12, 15, 18 & 21)
