Second Annual H. & F.A.O. Photo Contest

1. Contest will commence March 1st, 1960, and close midnight September 1st, 1960.
2. The contest is open to everyone, member, or non-member anywhere in Canada.
3. The contest is divided into three divisions (a) any black & white prints, (b) any colored prints, and (c) any colored slides. In all three divisions, pictures must depict the theme of archery. There are no age limits.
4. An entry fee of 25¢ must accompany each and every entry mailed in. An entry can consist of any number of prints and slides.
5. Each entry must include the full name, address, and age of contestant if under 16 years of age, and whether or not a member of any archery association. Such information MUST NOT BE PRINTED OR STAMPED on any print or slide.
6. Prints must not be smaller than 3x3 or larger than 5x7. Slides may be submitted in either the 35 mm. or 120/620 size.
7. The decision of the judges will be final. There shall be a First, Second, and Third prize for each division. In case no entry received for any one particular division, such remaining prizes shall be used as additional prizes for division(s) received.
8. All prints and slides will be returned immediately following the close of the contest including winning pictures after their display at the annual H. & F.A.O. Convention held in October.
9. Mail all entries directly to H. & F.A.O. Photo Contest, Box 10, Lively, Ontario.

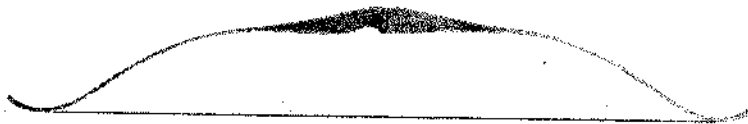

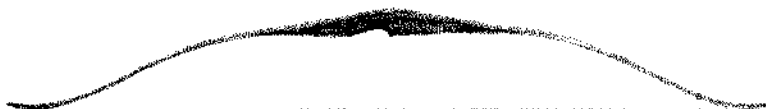
