2. CCES (English)

The Canadian Centre for Ethics in Sport (CCES) today released a discussion paper which examines the growing issues surrounding the use of unregulated supplement products by athletes. Released unofficially earlier this fall at the Athletes CAN Forum, the goal of the discussion paper is to assist in developing a co-ordinated approach to these issues, which have become a significant focal point in sport. The discussion paper, entitled Supplements and Sport, is available from the CCES' website (www.cces.ca).

In the last couple of months, there has been a flurry of media attention surrounding sport supplements. Allegations about contaminated supplements, inappropriate labelling, poor manufacturing practices as well as health and safety risks are causing concern and confusion among many users of these products. In elite sport, there are past incidents of Canadian athletes testing positive for the use of prohibited substances and claiming that they had taken a mislabelled or contaminated supplement product. Since athletes are under strict liability for any prohibited substance found in their system, they fear inadvertently ingesting prohibited substances through potentially contaminated sport supplement products. A post-Sydney Olympics study by the International Olympic Committee (IOC) discovered that out of a sample of 680 supplement products from around the world, up to 15% were contaminated with substances prohibited under the List of Prohibited Substances.

Paul Melia, Chief Executive Officer of the CCES, reaffirmed CCES' position that, "because of the risks associated with using unregulated products, the CCES has to discourage the use of all sport supplements. With current health and contamination issues, athletes using a supplement product are taking a huge gamble with their sporting careers. However, the CCES recognizes that athletes are using supplements and for this reason we are aiming to be able to give athletes more practical and reliable information regarding the safety and efficacy of supplement products."

2. CCES (en français)

Le Centre canadien pour l'éthique dans le sport (CCES) diffuse aujourd'hui un document de discussion qui examine les questions croissantes entourant l'utilisation non réglementée de produits supplémentaires par les athlètes. Diffusé officiellement plus tôt cet automne lors du Forum Athlètes CAN, le but du document de discussion est d'aider au développement d'une approche coordonnée quant à ces questions, lesquelles sont devenues cruciales dans le sport. Le document de discussion intitulé: Suppléments et Sport, est disponible sur le site Web du CCES, soit à l'adresse: www.cces.ca

Au cours des derniers mois, les médias ont apporté une grande attention aux questions entourant les suppléments alimentaires dans le sport. Les allégations touchant les suppléments contaminés, l'étiquetage inapproprié, les mauvaises pratiques de fabrication en plus des risques en matière de santé et sécurité entraînent préoccupation et confusion parmi de nombreux utilisateurs de ces produits. Dans le sport élite, il existe des incidents antérieurs d'athlètes canadiens qui ont obtenu des résultats de test positifs quant à l'utilisation de substances prohibées et qui prétendent qu'ils ont pris des suppléments présentant une étiquette erronée ou des suppléments contaminés. Étant donné que les athlètes sont entièrement responsables pour toute substance prohibée dans leur système, ils craignent d'ingérer par inadvertance des substances prohibées par l'entremise de produits supplémentaires de sport éventuellement contaminés.

Une étude menée après les Jeux olympiques de Sydney par le Comité international olympique (CIO) a permis de découvrir que parmi un échantillon de 680 produits supplémentaires de par le monde, jusqu'à 15 % de ces produits étaient contaminés avec des substances prohibées en vertu de la Liste de substances prohibées.

Paul Melia, chef de la direction du CCES réaffirme la position du CCES: « Étant donné les risques associés avec l'utilisation de produits non régis, le CCES doit décourager l'utilisation de tous les suppléments de sport. À la lumière des questions de santé et de contamination actuelles, les athlètes qui font usage de produits supplémentaires prennent une chance énorme au niveau de leur carrière dans le sport. Cependant, le CCES reconnaît que les athlètes utilisent des suppléments et pour cette raison, nous visons à être en mesure de fournir aux athlètes des renseignements plus pratiques et plus fiables en ce qui concerne la sécurité et l'efficacité des produits supplémentaires. »

C&R RULE INTREPRETATIONS

Questions asked by Allan R. (Al) Wills, Vice President International
FEDERATION OF CANADIAN ARCHERS INC.

Practice for Indoor Rounds: in Canada, we sometimes shoot 18m FITAs in two flights -

Flight 1 and Flight 2. There are two formats used as follows:

Format #1 - Flight 1 shoots 30 arrows, takes a short break then shoots 30 arrows. Then Flight 2 does the same thing.

Format #2 - Flight 1 shoots 30 arrows. Then Flight 2 shoots 30 arrows. Then Flight 1 shoots 30 arrows. Then Flight 2 shoots 30 arrows.

There are currently many different practice routines in use across the country for these formats and we are interested in standardizing within FITA rules.

- (1) What is the appropriate practice routine for each of these above formats?
- (2) Is there any requirement that the archers be allowed to practice on their own target butts?
- (3) Would it be OK to have a Canadian rule that requires organizers to allow archers to practice on their own butts for at least two ends?
- (4) In the case of Format 2, is it permissible for the archers returning to shoot their second 30 arrows to practice before doing so?

Answer by C&R

As to the questions asked we are unanimous that only format 1 is normally practised in FITA since the round consists of 60 arrows. Format 2 raises the question whether records can be shot at all. Format 2 is two rounds of 30 arrows, and the 30 arrow round does not exist according to FITA rules 4.5.2 and 5.3.1.

Q1 Article 3.19 refers to championships. For national purposes, you can adjust practice to the organizers and competitors. The archers do have a right to practice arrows, however. Format 2 is not foreseen at all. Only one practice session is foreseen for 60 arrows.

Q2 Practice just before the competition should take place on the target assigned to the competitor (there is no explicit rule, but this is common sense and common practice).

Q3 Yes, the answer follows from the introductory remark.

Q4 Format 2 is not according to what is practised in FITA and would not be a FITA event, practice arrows before the second round of 30 arrows would break FITA rules but could be accepted if you introduce the event as a national Canadian event. Why break away from FITA practice, however? Archers can warm up between rounds, if organisers have a warm up Field of Play at a different location (hall or section of hall). This facility can be provided at the option of the Organising Committee.

INTERPRETATION DU REGLEMENT C&R

Questions posées par Allan R. (Al) Wills, Vice-Président International, FEDERATION DES ARCHERS CANADIENS INC.

Echauffement pour épreuves en salle: au Canada, les épreuves FITA 18m sont parfois tirées en deux série – Série 1 et Série 2. Il existe les deux formats ci-dessous:

Format #1 - La Série1 tire 30 flèches, fait une courte pause puis tire à nouveau 30 flèches. Ensuite, la Série 2 procède de la même manière.

Format #2 - La Série 1 tire 30 flèches. Puis la Série 2 tire 30 flèches. Puis la Série 1 tire 30 flèches. Puis la Série 2 tire 30 flèches.

Pour l'instant, plusieurs procédures d'échauffement différentes sont pratiquées à travers le pays pour ces formats et nous sommes intéressés à standardiser cela selon les règlements de la FITA.

(1) Quelle est la procédure d'échauffement appropriée pour chacun des formats ci-dessus?

(2) Est-il exigé que les archers soient autorisés à s'entraîner sur leur propre cible?

(3) Serait-il possible d'avoir un règlement canadien qui demanderait aux organisateurs d'autoriser les archers à s'entraîner sur leur propre cible pour au moins deux volées.

(4) Dans le cas du Format 2, est-il permis d'autoriser les archers à s'entraîner avant de tirer leur deuxième série de 30 flèches.

Réponse du C&R

Concernant les questions posées, nous sommes unanimes à dire que seul le Format 1 est normalement utilisé au sein de la FITA, puisque l'épreuve est constitué de 60 flèches. Le Format 2 pose un problème au niveau des records. Le Format 2 consiste à tirer 2 épreuves de 30 flèches, l'épreuve de 30 flèches n'existant pas selon les règlements de la FITA, articles 4.5.2 et 5.3.1.

Q1 L'article 3.19 se réfère aux championnats. Dans des buts nationaux, on peut ajuster l'entraînement selon les organisateurs et les compétiteurs. Les archers ont cependant le droit de tirer des flèches à l'échauffement. Le Format 2 n'est pas du tout prévu. Seule une session d'échauffement est prévue pour 60 flèches.

Q2 L'entraînement juste avant la compétition devrait avoir lieu sur la cible assignée au compétiteur (il n'y a aucune règle explicite, mais il en est du sens commun et de la pratique normale).

Q3 Oui, la réponse découle de la remarque d'introduction

Q4 Le Format 2 n'est pas en accord avec la FITA et ne serait pas reconnu comme une épreuve FITA. L'entraînement avant la seconde série de 30 flèches irait à l'encontre des règlements FITA, mais pourrait tout de même être accepté si vous introduisez cet événement comme compétition nationale canadienne. Cependant, pourquoi vouloir aller à l'encontre de la pratique au sein de la FITA? Les archers peuvent s'échauffer entre les épreuves, si les organisateurs ont un terrain de jeu d'échauffement à un autre endroit (salle ou section de salle). Ces installations peuvent être mises à disposition au gré du Comité d'Organisation.

7. Applications for National Outdoors and Clinic for Judges Caledon 2004

The FCA judge committee chairperson now is accepting applications from qualified judges wishing to participate in the next Canadian Target & Field Championships that will be held in Caledon, ON from July 31 to August 7.

All judge applicants will be considered, not only on experience, but also from the perspective of the development of Canadian Archery. There will be a certain amount of FCA financial support (to be defined) to defray travel costs. This financial assistance is limited, and judges are urged to seek additional support from their provincial associations. In the past, judges also received a per diem (\$30.00), accommodation (double occupancy) and local transport.

FCA will announce the judge team by the beginning of March 2004.

National Judges Clinic

Usually, FCA organises a national judge clinic on the days preceding the Field Championships (Friday and Saturday July 30 & 31). National judge candidates and especially judges of this area are encouraged to attend. All other judges can use the seminar to refresh their knowledge and

challenge their thinking. Usually, the seminar costs \$50.00. Seminar candidates will be offered the chance to judge during the tournament under the supervision of a senior judge or mentor.

In this cross-cultural investigation, the A.A. compared USA and Korean athletes' goal orientations and intrinsic motivation. Middle school-aged athletes from two independent samples completed the Task and Ego Orientation in Sport Questionnaire (TEOSQ) and the Intrinsic Motivation Inventory (IMI). A 2 x 3 x 2 (Culture x Grade x Gender) MANOVA on task orientation, ego orientation, and the indices of intrinsic motivation revealed culture, grade, and gender main effects. Athletes from the USA scored higher in task orientation and lower in ego orientation than Korean athletes. Overall, the findings indicate (a) USA athletes were more intrinsically motivated than Korean athletes; (b) athletes in their first year of middle school reported a greater sense of competence in sport than those in their second or final year, and (c) gender differences were small with males scoring higher than females on perceived competence.
