Vancouver Province series on Sport Funding (Part 2)

Volunteer army deserves medal: 'We put on our grubby clothes and fix up place' by Terry Bell

The Province Series: The Price of Gold: Part 2 Second in a six-day series examining how Canada funds and develops elite amateur athletes.

At the Omega Gymnastics Academy in Coquitlam committed parents are the glue that keep things together. They raise the money. They hire the coaches. They sweep the floors, change the light bulbs and make sure the heating bills get paid. Friday nights are work party nights. Attendance is mandatory.

"We put on our grubby clothes, move in and fix up the place," says Dr. Bill Mackie, a former Canadian national team gymnast and father of Gael Mackie, who is the current Canadian women's champion. "We want an environment that's safe, that we can feel good about, so we do it," he says.

It's just another example of the lengths to which Canadian parents will go to ensure their kids can reach their full potential in their chosen sport. The Mackies -- Bill and wife Dr. Susan Mackie -- also have 10-year-old daughter Charlotte at Omega. She'll begin competing in novice meets next year. Their son Owen, 16, trains at the Twisters Club in Abbotsford. He's the top-ranked national novice on the high bar.

"We spend a lot less time doctoring than we do driving the kids to training," says Mackie, who represented Canada at the 1972 Olympics in Munich. Depending on how much time a child trains at Omega, parents are required to commit a specific number of volunteer hours and raise a certain amount of money. If your daughter trains 20 hours a week, you'll have to put in 70 hours a year at the club and bring in \$360.

The Omega club is for girls only. There are about 300 in the recreational program and another 50 to 60 in competitive programs. Omega has hired five Russian coaches. Other than those, the only paid staff member is Denise Pineau, whose daughter Nicole also competes.

The Omega club has set itself up as a non-profit society, making it eligible to receive about \$100,000 from the province through Newton Bingo Country. Another \$39,500 comes from the City of Coquitlam through its Gender Equities program, which provides help to girls' sport.

Sometimes the parents feel they're on a treadmill. "We're always one step ahead of a crisis," says Mackie, who kicked in \$1,000 from his own pocket a few years ago to help fund a boys' national training centre in Brentwood, N.B. "We get letters saying, 'We're planning on reducing the funding,' and asking us to find ways to be more self-sufficient. "But you can't stop. If expenses aren't paid, the gyms close -- and then what?"

The Province Series: The Price of Gold: Part 3 Third in a six-day series examining how Canada funds and develops elite amateur athletes.

Before the start of the 2002 Winter Olympics in Salt Lake City, Canada's Beckie Scott, an eventual silver medallist, was reduced to this: Along with her female cross country ski teammates she posed partially nude for a calendar to raise funds for the trip. Well, Toronto go-getter, fund raiser and eternal optimist Jane Roos thinks she has a better plan.

Six years ago Roos started raising money to help Canadian athletes train for and reach the Olympics. Her organization -- now called See you in Athens 2004 (www.seeyouinathens.com) -- raised \$500,000 for athletes competing in the 2000 Summer Games in Sydney and the 2002 Winter Games in Salt Lake City.

The goal is to raise another \$5 million between now and Athens. Last month Mastercard Canada kicked in \$500,000. Every loonie of every donation goes directly to Canadian

athletes. Athletes send in detailed applications. The applications are reviewed and, if accepted, they're given \$10,000 (team), \$7,000 (pair) or \$6,000 for a single athlete.

"The cool thing is if someone gives us a cheque we can tell them which athlete the money went to," says Roos, who gave Surrey wrestler Daniel Igali \$6,000 prior to his winning a gold medal at the 2000 Olympics in Sydney. "That's how detailed we are."

"We need to support our athletes now. If the only reason you can't get to your goal is because of a lack of funding support, that's awful," says Roos, a former heptathlete. "Especially in a country like Canada that has so much. I just think as a country we need to value sport more."

"Mastercard is involved with the NHL, the PGA and World Cup soccer. They liked the grassroots nature of this project. As we started learning about the fund we really started to like it a lot," says Mastercard Canada president Walt Macnee. "It's grassroots. It's pure. It's a couple of people in an office working all night on a shoestring. We like the simplicity of it ... the money goes directly to the athletes. It's so that they can eat right, it's not for limousines."

"Daniel Igali winning gold, down on his knees kissing the Canadian flag ... who wouldn't want a piece of that?" Roos is fine-tuning the program so a donor can be linked with an athlete from their province. Send in \$100 to help a striving swimmer and then root for them in Athens.

The fundraising involves a group called Talent Supporting Talent. Ron McLean of the CBC Hockey Night in Canada is on board. So are the Barenaked Ladies, Blue Rodeo and the Tragically Hip. On Aug. 17, exactly a year before the start of the Athens Games, See you in Athens held a gala dinner in Toronto. Fifty-two corporations paid \$2,004 for a table. Since the CBC did a documentary on them this year, they've had hundreds of donations. Some people ask for a tax receipt, some don't. Roos also hustles corporations to donate air miles. She'd like to come up with 50 or 60 gas cards worth \$100 each.

As for the lack of government support for Canadian athletes, Roos says, "I don't get upset. That's a waste of energy. I get excited about what's possible."
