The 2005 WADA Prohibited List: Summary Of Revisions

(Ottawa, Ontario – December 1, 2004) – The Canadian Centre for Ethics in Sport (CCES) would like to summarize for the Canadian sport community the most significant revisions that will appear on the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) 2005 Prohibited List. The new Prohibited List will replace WADA's 2004 Prohibited List as of January 1, 2005.

Attention members of Excellence 2004, this is a reminder that scores for the 2004 ranking list must be submitted to Joan McDonald by midnight December 31, 2004 EST.

Effective January 1, 2005 all score cards must be accompanied with the full results sheet from registered tournaments in Canada in order to use the score for Excellence ranking.

Funding to FITA World Target Championships, Madrid 2005:

FCA will advertise soon for the national team coach position. Two regional team coaches will accompany the team. All 3 positions will be fully funded by FCA. FTAQ and FCA will fund 50% of the costs to send a qualified FTAQ-sanctioned level 3 coach to Madrid. Any residual funding will be applied to athlete travel according to squad ranking for that team.

CBET transition starts in earnest next weekend in Miramichi, NB when Kathy Millar runs a pilot course for learning facilitators in the non-competitive stream – instructing beginners. A second pilot will be run by James Wiebe in Prince George, BC at the end of February 2005. The course will replace the old level 1 technical and theory in one weekend. Topics include: Make Ethical Decisions, Analyze Performance, Provide Support to Athletes in Training and Plan a Practice. In the next fiscal year, FCA's Coach Committee hopes to pilot both the instructor – intermediate, replacing the old level 2, and in the competitive stream, Introduction to Competition that will take part of the new level 3 material. 5. Jean Perron, new President and CEO of Internationaux du Sport de Montréal

Having managed Internationaux du Sport de Montréal (ISM) as Interim Vice-President and Chief Executive Officer, and further to Marc Campagna's departure, Jean Perron was unanimously appointed President and CEO of the organization by the Board of Directors on November 18, 2004.

Jean Perron is no stranger to Montreal's world of event management. He was Program manager for the Old Port of Montréal Corporation from 1992 to 1999, elevating this site in just a few years to one of Quebec's top tourist attractions. As promoter, he has presented, among others, the family Christmas event La crèche vivante (living nativity scene) for seven years, to the delight of over 700,000 spectators. In 1999, ISM called on his vast experience in event organization and management to head many Montreal's bids including the one for the 11th FINA World Swimming Championships. Mr. Perron was appointed Vice-President, Development and Strategy at ISM in 2001.

A ground-breaker, negotiator, consensus builder and experienced manager, Jean Perron has an extensive network of contacts, both here and around the world. Known and valued by private and public partners, he is the ideal person to lead ISM in the pursuit of their canvassing mission. Jean Perron expects to present the organization's next action plan soon.

6. Canadian Olympic Committee

Sets Bold New Direction To Become Top Medal Winner at 2010 Olympic Games

To improve Canada's performance at the Olympic Games, particularly to achieve its goal of being the top medal-winning country at the 2010 Olympic Winter Games in Vancouver/Whistler, the Canadian Olympic Committee (COC) has set ambitious performance and medal targets for upcoming Games and is embarking on a bold new plan to achieve them.

The COC's goal is to place among the top three nations at the 2006 Olympic Winter Games in Turin (25 medals), among the top 16 countries at the 2008 Games in Beijing (18 medals) and first at the 2010 Games in Vancouver/Whistler (35 medals). These goals are part of the COC's strategic plan, which was unanimously endorsed by the organization's Board of Directors at its semi-annual meeting in Toronto this weekend. The COC Board includes representation from all of Canada's summer, winter and Pan American sport federations as well as Olympic coaches and athletes.

"The COC believes that Canada's athletes are among the best in the world but they need and deserve additional support to achieve international podium success," said COC President Michael Chambers. "We want to give Canadians something to cheer about at upcoming Olympic Games, particularly our home Games in 2010. Our goal of improving Canada's Olympic performance is achievable with the support and collaboration of our sport partners."

These partners include athletes, coaches, national sport federations, Canadian Sport Centres, the Vancouver Organizing Committee for the 2010 Olympic Winter Games, the Calgary Olympic Development Association and business and private supporters. The COC also recognizes the need to partner more effectively with all three levels of government to generate the additional funding required to properly fund high performance sport in Canada.

"It's important for the COC to be the collective voice for the sport community in Canada to advocate for increased funding and support for Canada's Olympic hopefuls," said Olympian and COC Board member Diane Jones Konihowski. "It is a tremendous honour to compete for Canada at the Olympic Games and I believe this new plan, with the proper support and funding, will lead to more Canadian athletes reaching the Olympic podium."

As part of its strategic plan, the COC is restructuring itself to focus more on engaging athletes and coaches in its activities, advocating for increased funding and changes to the current sport system, fundraising, international training and preparation programs for athletes, holistic athlete support programs and educational programs. Specific initiatives include:

- * Organizing high quality team preparation and training programs as part of the COC's newly established "Excellence Series" to better prepare Olympic hopefuls, coaches and sports for upcoming Olympic Games;
- * Conducting a pre-Games, on location training camp for athletes and coaches prior to the Olympic Games in Beijing;
- * Engaging the COC's newly restructured athlete advisory body, the Athletes Council, into all high performance planning initiatives;
- * Building on a similar initiative with winter sports, to work collectively with Canada's summer sports to set future performance targets and plans to achieve them, with the assistance of international sport experts;
- * Expanding the COC's athlete and community relations programs geared to increasing awareness of the Olympic movement in Canada, ultimately leading to increased funding for high performance sport;
- * Creating a new Canadian Olympic Excellence Foundation to raise funds to support high performance sport
