Attention members of Excellence 2004, this is a reminder that scores for the 2004 ranking list must be submitted to Joan McDonald by midnight December 31, 2004 EST.

Effective January 1, 2005 all score cards must be accompanied with the full results sheet from registered tournaments in Canada in order to use the score for Excellence ranking.

Funding to FITA World Target Championships, Madrid 2005:  
FCA will advertise soon for the national team coach position. Two regional team coaches will accompany the team. All 3 positions will be fully funded by FCA. FTAQ and FCA will fund 50% of the costs to send a qualified FTAQ-sanctioned level 3 coach to Madrid. Any residual funding will be applied to athlete travel according to squad ranking for that team.

**2. Registration for FCA's Regional Indoor Championships**

Clubs wishing to host the FCA Regional Indoor Championships, March 5 and/or March 6, 2005 may register online now using the "Register Host Site" link at:

Unless your Provincial Organisation organizes hosting sites, any club may apply to host this event. It must be officiated by a Provincial level judge and must be run according to the official rules. Every effort is made to ensure that the Championship is held under similar conditions at all host sites.

In the past, a number of clubs have run the FCA Championship in conjunction with the COPANARCO indoor MICA event. You are strongly discouraged from doing this as these events run under different rules regarding ages, equipment divisions, scoring and target type/size. It is VERY difficult for archers, judges and the DOS to run either event properly with all of these differences.

Last year 700 archers competed at 28 sites across the country. Plan now for your club to participate in this major FCA event. ### **3. MICA 2005**

#### **CHAMPIONSHIP DESCRIPTION**

These championships include 2 events:

- \* the individual event;
- \* the team event

Important: When an individual or a team shoots more than one round, at one or several registered sites, only the FIRST score shot is used for the MICA (NOT the best one). This regulation applies for each division : One score (the first one) per archer and per division.

Date:

The Multi-sites Indoor Championship of the Americas takes place every year during a period predetermined by COPANARCO.

In 2005, the Multi-sites Indoor Championship of the Americas will be held from: January 1 to April 30/ 2005

#### **INDIVIDUAL EVENT REGULATIONS**

##### **Eligibility**

Archers in good standing with a National Archery Federation member of COPANARCO are eligible to shoot the Multi-sites Indoor Archery Championships of Americas. These archers can shoot at any approved site throughout the Americas.

##### **Distance**

The event consists of the 18 meter FITA Indoor Round, i.e. two (2) rounds of thirty (30) arrows each, totaling sixty (60) arrows.

##### **Classes**

In each of the two (2) equipment divisions (see below), there are five (4) age categories in each gender:

Cadet - Junior - Senior - Master  
Therefore there are a total of sixteen (16) classes.

#### Equipment divisions

- \* Recurve division, according FITA Rules
- \* Compound division, according FITA Rules

#### Age categories

An athlete may participate in the Cadet Class if he/she is younger than 16 or if his/her 16th birthday takes place during 2005.

An athlete may participate in the Junior Class if he/she is younger than 18 or if his/her 18th birthday takes place during 2005.

An athlete may participate in the Masters Class if he/she is older than 50 or if his/her 50th birthday takes place during 2005.

All ages are eligible to compete in the Senior Class.

Cadets, Juniors and Seniors may choose to compete in the Seniors class at his/her discretion.

Cadets also may choose to compete in the Junior class at his/her discretion.

#### Target Face

- The Recurve divisions shoot at a 40 cm diameter face, or a 40 cm triple face, whatever the age and gender and do not score with the inner ten ring.
- The Compound divisions shoot at a 40 cm triple face, and score with the inner ten, whatever the age and gender.

### TEAM EVENT REGULATIONS

#### Team composition

A team is made of three (3) archers from the same club who have the same gender, age class and equipment division.

If an archer belongs to several clubs, he/she will be allowed to shoot for the club through which he/she became member of his/her National Archery Federation.

#### Eligibility

The teams / clubs composed of archers in good standing with a National Archery Federation, which is a current member of COPANARCO, are eligible to shoot the Multi-sites Indoor Championship of the Americas. These teams may shoot at any approved site throughout the Americas.

Each team must be registered by the site Coordinator, before the first scoring arrow of the team event.

#### Distance

The event is a Team elimination round, but without DIRECT opponent. The event consists of 3 ends of 9 arrows (3 per archer) shot in 3 minutes at 18 meters, with a total of 27 arrows. Only one round is shot.

#### Classes

In each of the two (2) equipment divisions (see below), there are two (2) age categories in each gender: Juniors and Senior. Therefore there are 8 team classes.

#### Equipment division

- \* Recurve division, according FITA Rules

\* Compound division, according FITA Rules

#### Age categories

An athlete may participate in the Junior Class if he/she is younger than 18 or if his/her 18th birthday takes place during 2005.

All ages are eligible to compete in the Senior Class.

Juniors may choose to compete in the Seniors class at his/her discretion.

#### Target Face

The Recurve divisions DO NOT score with the inner ten ring.

The compound divisions DO score with the inner ten.

The MICA Event may be held any time between January 1 and April 30, 2005.

2. Scores shot after April 30, 2005 cannot be considered for MICA.

4. Scores sent to Jacqui Jenskey after May 10, 2005 will NOT be entered or included in the medallists or final results listing!
