I have been asked to form a committee for FCA on Women in Archery. The FCA considers this a very important issue and solicits your input. It's an age-old question: Where are all the Women?

Archery is no different from most sports. There is a definite minority of women as participants at all levels & all disciplines, but not in governance. It would be nice to have

some sort of task force that travelled to clubs and different provinces, but like most projects there just isn't the resources. Therefore, we have to make the best use of the resources we have!

There is no easy answer, but maybe by discussing the issue here, we can get some feedback and adjust our thinking somewhat to generate more interest by women and more enjoyment for those already in the sport. All comments are welcome, from women and men.

Consider answering the following (not an exhaustive list):

- Where are all the women?
- Why do women start in the sport, but do not stay?
- Why does it seem there are more women in governance as a percentage than in participation?
- What are the barriers for women that men don't have?
- Is it just that archery is a man's sport?
- Is there a place for women in 3D?
- Is there something we could/should be doing?
- What can be done short or long term?

The FCA Executive is calling for official bids to host the 2006 national target/field & 3D championships. For 2006, the rotating 3D schedule designates the province of Alberta.

4. Ian Bird of Ottawa named Executive Director of the Canadian Professional Coaches Association

The Coaching Association of Canada (CAC) announced today that Ian Bird of Ottawa has been named the executive director of the Canadian Professional Coaches Association (CPCA), the professional arm of CAC.

Bird, a two-time Olympian in men's field hockey, has been one of Canada's leading advocates for athletes in sport. Since 2000, he has been the CEO of the Esteem Team. The Esteem Team is an athlete-driven youth development organization that cultivates positive characteristics and confidence in youth through athlete interactions, education, and sport. Bird has also provided his expertise to the Sport Matters Group, Athletes CAN, and the advisory committee of the Secretary of State.

"My objective will be to help coaches find their voice in the community and improve their working environment," said Bird. "My past experience as a high performance athlete and working with athlete groups brings a commitment to a partnership approach between coaches and athletes."

CPCA advocates on behalf of the coaching profession and establishes, promotes, and enforces the professional values, standards, and competencies set by its members. CPCA works to increase the recognition and respect of the work that coaches do and the qualifications that they bring to the development of athletic potential; to set standards of education and ethical practice appropriate to the coaching setting; to provide a voice for coaches such that their concerns and issues will be represented in all aspects of sport policy development; and to assist with the professional development needs of coaches. CPCA offers the designation of Chartered Professional Coach (ChPC), which represents the highest qualifications of coaching.

5. New generic scorecards

Thanks to Greg Durward (BC), new generic scorecards are available for Indoor rounds (18m FITA, 25m FITA, Canadian 300) and Outdoor rounds (Field, FITA, Double Elimination, Olympic Round). There are also control sheets and pairing charts. These scorecards contain all current FCA classes and divisions along with current distances for FITA rounds. They have room to add a club name and logo on the top.
