9. COC In the Loop

First of all, I would like to extend our thanks to everyone who attended this year's COC Congress, which took place last weekend in Montreal, and to those whose contributions made the annual event an unqualified success. The weekend was truly a celebration of excellence in Canadian sport past, present and future.

More than 200 Canadian sport representatives attended the three-day event that began on April 15 with the Executive Committee meeting followed by the COC Board of Directors meeting, and the annual Canadian Olympic Hall of Fame Dinner and Induction ceremony. The following two days included workshops and discussions important to advancing sport in Canada, presentations by keynote speakers, the Annual General Meeting and a brunch to honour the Canadian athletes who will be competing at the Olympic Games in Athens this summer.

Canadian Olympic Hall of Fame

The Canadian Olympic Hall of Fame Dinner on April 16 was one of the highlights of this year's Congress. We were very fortunate to have had both The Honorable Stan Keyes, Minister of State for Sport and Jean-Marc Fournier, Ministre des Affaires municipales, du Sport et du Loisir du Québec, speak of their respective government's commitment to working with the COC to further support athletes and achieve excellence in Canadian sport.

The inductees were honoured at a gala event held at the historic Windsor Station in Montreal. The 2004 inductees included: Myriam Bédard; the 1996 Men's 4x100 metre Relay Team (Athletics) of Donovan Bailey, Carlton Chambers, Robert Esmie, Glenroy Gilbert and Bruny Surin; and the 1998 Men's Short Track Relay Team (Speed Skating) of Éric Bédard, Derrick Campbell, François Drolet and Marc Gagnon. Also honoured were swimming coach Dr. Jeno Tihanyi and canoe/kayak athlete and builder Bert Oldershaw. The 2003 IOC Award for "Sporting Excellence" was presented to Speed Skating Canada and accepted by Jean Dupré, Director General, on behalf of the organization.

COC Congress

As part of a new program this year, the Congress featured three workshops on April 17 with a number of distinguished speakers including: Gilbert Felli, Olympic Games Executive Director, IOC; Richard Pound, Canadian IOC member; Jim Page, Managing Director, Sport Performance Services of the United States Olympic Committee; Craig McLatchey, CEO, Olympic Games Knowledge Services and Jean-Pierre Bastien, Assistant Deputy-Minister, Secrétariat au Loisir et au Sport Québec. Topics covered included: the Impact of Hosting an Olympic Games in Canada, Provincial Contribution to Canadian Sport Excellence and Canada's Best Ever Program. A luncheon address was given by John Furlong, CEO of the Vancouver Organizing Committee for the 2010 Olympic and Paralympic Winter Games. On the evening of April 17, the Quebec government, in partnership with the COC, hosted a reception to celebrate sporting excellence in Quebec at Montreal's Olympic Park, where members of the Quebec sporting community were recognized for their contributions to advancing amateur sport in Quebec. Special recognition awards were given to: la Fondation de l'athlète d'excellence du Québec, Club Sportif MAA, Club de la médaille d'or, Sports-Québec, National multisport centre - Montréal, the Montreal 1976 Olympic Games Organizing Committee, the City of Montreal and the Province of Quebec. An individual award was presented to renowned SRC broadcaster Richard Garneau who has covered a remarkable 18 Olympic Games over his 50-year career. On April 18, the weekend wrapped up with the Annual General Meeting and a Canada Life brunch celebrating Greece and the athletes who will be representing Canada in Athens at the 2004 Olympic Games. The brunch featured a presentation of a lucky horseshoe and loonie by Dr. Gene Sutton, Chef de Mission for the 2003 Pan American Games, to David Bedford, Chef de Mission for the 2004 Olympic Games, to wish David and his team great success in Athens this summer. The event also featured the talents of local Greek dancers and musicians. At the AGM, copies of the COC's 2003 Annual Report were made available to Board members.

COC Board of Directors meeting

Several proposals were approved at the Board of Directors meeting on April 16, including: the 2005-2012 Strategic Plan; the COC's Advocacy Efforts, which received unanimous support, and the 2005-2008 Sport Funding Model.

2005-2012 Strategic Plan

The Board approved the COC's Strategic Plan for 2005-2012, which builds on the COC's vision of seeing Canada as one of the top performing sporting nations in the world and a country in which sport is central to our culture, evidenced by an active and healthy population participating in sport at all levels and in all communities.

The overall mission for the COC, as outlined in the plan, is: To achieve podium success at Olympic Games and to advance the Olympic movement in Canada. We believe international podium success can only be achieved by providing Canada's top performing athletes, coaches and NSFs with the support they require to successfully compete on the world stage. We envision Canada among the Top 3 nations at the 2006 Olympic Winter Games and first among all nations when Canada plays host to the 2010 Olympic Winter Games. We are aiming for a Top 12 position in the final standings of the 2008 Olympic Games and want to achieve a Top 8 performance at the 2012 Olympic Games. The Strategic Plan outlines these and other objectives in detail, and the strategic approach to achieving the COC's mission.

Advocacy Efforts

The Board of Directors, comprised of representatives from all 51 National Sport Federations, formally endorsed the COC as the advocacy voice for high performance sport in Canada on behalf of all Olympic and Pan American sports. Building on the goals and successes of the COC's recent advocacy initiatives, this endorsement supports the COC's upcoming initiatives in continuing to advocate on behalf of high performance sport with the federal and provincial governments and other funding partners to create a better understanding of the benefits to all Canadians in increased investment in the support, structure and resources necessary to excel in high performance sport.

2005-2012 Sport Funding Model

The Board approved a funding model that consolidates all of the COC's current funding programs under its Canadian Olympic Excellence Fund. Under this model the largest portion of funds from the COC's Excellence Fund will be invested into sports that have demonstrated podium and Top 8 potential at Olympic Games, consistent with the COC strategic plan. The COC recognizes that all of Canada's Sport Funding Partners must collaborate to support our athletes in order to achieve the podium success we are seeking. The COC is committed to proactively engaging these partners to collectively provide a sustainable sport-funding model.

Team Canada website

I also want to take this opportunity to highlight our revamped Team Canada website, created especially for Canadian athletes by Canadian athletes through the COC's Athlete Services and Programs initiative. This site is designed to help athletes achieve excellence in their field of play and help them with their career development needs. I would like to thank CBC, Radio-Canada, General Mills, Home Depot, Olympic Spirit, Monster.ca and RBC Financial Group for developing career opportunities in their organizations for active and retired Olympians. Athletes gain invaluable financial support and work experience through our Career Opportunity Program, offered by a number of our corporate sponsors and partners. This program provides athletes with the unique opportunity to design a work schedule that fits with their training and competition schedules. In turn, our corporate sponsors and partners benefit by employing Olympic-calibre employees.

The Team Canada site provides Canadian athletes with valuable information on the programs and resources available to assist them in their athletic careers including: the mentoring network, where athletes can turn to seasoned Olympians for advice; information on upcoming services provided by the COC such as the Athens Athlete Orientation Sessions to take place across Canada in the months leading up to the 2004 Athens Olympic Games; and the Olympic Excellence Series to take place in Lake Louise in June, where Olympians from the past share their wisdom and experiences with Olympic hopefuls.
