Hey gang!

Not a lot of time here for internet but Nolan and I found one in a "great" part of town... let's just say that we just saw a HUGE guy walking his dog and he was carrying a big

"beating stick" in case anyone messed with him... made us little two guys feel very safe... not...

Well here's a quick report from the field so that we can hurry back to our safer part of the woods...

Overall the team is doing AMAZING!!!!!! We have 27 medals already hanging in the Canadian rooms (medals are given for each distance, overall FITA, team round, and individual ORs) and we still have three days of competitions left... we've gotten to hear the Canadian anthem MANY times now and sang proudly on all of them. Sometimes we even continue after the music (mostly because Brian gets on a roll) but everyone seems not to mind and is pretty amused about our nationalistic pride.

Here's a quick summary of the medals and general standings after the FITA:

Side note... Kristin had a mild case of heat stroke today and after missing 2 ends (made up later) she returned in the last 20 seconds of the 3rd end to the line and in 20 seconds shot a 29 out of 30 at 30m... wow!!!!!! She seemed fine this evening when it came to shopping...

Nolan Johnson - 2nd - 5 silver medals

AR guys:

Alec Denis - 1st - Gold medal

Norbert Murphy - 1st Gold medal

Senior Men Recurve:

Jonathan Ohayon - 4th (1 silver medal)

Hugh McDonald - 10th (we think)

Brian Arcand - 14th (we've just been in 42 degree heat for many days... that's what Brian's thermometer read on the field today)

Tomorrow is some of the OR rounds and Friday is the other half of them (depending on class you are in). On Saturday is the team round and the Men Recurve Team from Canada is currently ranked 2nd out of 7 teams so are looking good for doing well there too.

Other than that Montezuma's revenge (anyone that has travelled to South America should know what I mean) has hit 6 people on the team already... most are doing well and Immodium is running like water.

As a side note... water here is more expensive than gas or beer...

All is great and the team is working VERY well together and having a great time.

Now Nolan and I have to run.

July 7<sup>th</sup>

Hello,

We had the first day of competition yesterday. It went great. I got 272 at 90 m (a personal best), and 306 at 70 m (3 points from my best). I was 10 or 11th at 90m and 8th at 70m. There are over 30 of male recurve shooters. I finished the day second of the Canadians.

Today my 50 m wasn't that good, I got a 277. My sight had moved a lot since the practice day so my 30 mark was not correct and I had to guess. I guessed wrong and I shot what would have been a 5 but on a 3 spot target is a miss with my first arrow. I ended up with 321 with a miss which isn't that bad. My FITA score was 1176, a PB for this year, but could have been better if not for the second half. This put me 13th in the male senior recurve and 18th overall in the male recurve ranking. I also moved down to 4th in the Canadians. I shoot the Olympic round in two days and I am the 4th for the team round on the next day, (a team round has 3 people, but I can be subbed in).

It is hot here but I like it and am not bothered by it in the least. I drink about 5 L of water each day, (3 or 4 litres at the range). Hugh and I brought our thermometer clocks to the range today to see how hot it was. In the sun it peaked at 43.5 celcius and averaged about 39 or 40. In the shade it was a bit cooler at about 32 to 35. The weather was perfect for shooting, the heat was nice and there was no wind.

I shot with a guy from Barbados and Columbia, both of whom spoke English. I was kind of hoping to shoot with people that only spoke Spanish cause it is really fun trying to speak to them.

The Canadians got a lot of medals. They give out medals for each distance and for the overall FITA. For each winner they would play the national anthem. The awards today were about 2 hours and over an hour yesterday.

All and all I am having a great time and I can't wait to come to the next South American tournament
