### **A month to forget for Marie-Pier Beudet – from Sportcom news service**

The month of June 2005 is one to forget for archer **Marie-Pier Beudet**: an operation and convalescence slowing her training, abnormal performance at the world championships, a wrist injury and her archery equipment went missing between Madrid and Montréal!



The Lévis athlete, who was operated on for an ovarian cyst on May 3, needed to convalesce for three weeks, which caused a noticeable setback in preparation for the world championships held in Madrid, Spain, last week where her results proved to be disastrous.

She finished 98<sup>th</sup> out of 109 participants, with a score of 1193 (sur 1440), being eliminated in the preliminary round. "I was not ready, neither physically nor mentally, to compete at the world level," she reported to Sportcom on Sunday. "The convalescence et the wrist injury prevented me from training adequately."

Her father and coach **Denis Beudet** saw her poor performance. "It's the first time in four years that Marie-Pier shot less than 1200," he observed. "I was not the only one to notice her poor showing in à Madrid. Quite a few people who knew her came to ask what was happening. For two months, she has been able to train only four or five times whereas normally her training programme requires that each week. The only consolation is that we saw a good progression between the first arrow she shot and her last."

The 18-year-old athlete vowed that would not affect her. "Yes, it upset me. But I'll come back. I am not discouraged in spite of it. I will count the next Canadian championships as a chance to come back. Over the next weeks, I will be able to prepare well...if I can get my bow back."

Beudet will defend her first national senior title at the Canadian championships to be held July 22-30, in Saint-Jean, New-Brunswick.

OTTAWA (CIS) - Canadian Interuniversity Sport, as the Canadian representative of the Fédération Internationale du Sport Universitaire (FISU), announced on Monday the athletes and staff who will represent Canada in **archery** at the **2005 Summer Universiade**.

The 23rd Summer Universiade, regrouping 9,000 participants from 170 countries, will be held August 11-21 in Izmir, Turkey.

Canada will send one archer to Turkey, **Brian Arcand**, Richmond Hill, ON.

The support staff will be comprised of head of team **Kathleen Millar** of Winchester, ON. The five-day archery tournament is scheduled for August 12-16.

### About CIS and the Universiade

The Summer Universiade is a multi-sport event that takes place every two years, and is second in size only to the Olympic Games. The Universiade is open to competitors between the ages of 17 and 28 in the year of the Games, who are full-time post-secondary students (university, college, CEGEP) or have graduated from a post-secondary institution within the previous year of the event.

The 23rd Summer Universiade to be held Aug. 11-21, 2005 in Izmir, Turkey will feature some 8,000 athletes from 170 countries competing in the following sports: archery, athletics, basketball, diving, fencing, gymnastics, sailing, soccer, swimming, taekwondo, tennis, volleyball, water polo, and wrestling.
