**2. CAC - NCCP**

In order to facilitate data entry and in order to adhere to the Coaching Association of Canada's (CAC) Privacy Policy, CAC requested that effective April 1, 2005 all delivery agencies begin using the new NCCP Registration Form that was developed last year. The new form addresses a number of issues that the old NCCP Course Register Form does not. The new NCCP Registration Form:

- articulates CAC's Privacy Policy (which we are required to do prior to collecting personal information)
- is coded for Database tracking with a sequential number which is essential for all partners in order to track their coaches
- collects additional information relevant to communicating with coaches and for market research (e-mail addresses, Aboriginal, RCMP, etc.)

- tracks information about both the old NCCP courses as well as the new NCCP contexts (e.g. Competition – Introduction Part A)

For those delivery agencies that would prefer to use an electronic form to submit their workshop information, CAC has developed an official NCCP Electronic Registration Form that is now available to all delivery agencies. There is no cost to using the approved NCCP Electronic Registration Form.

Please be advised that copies of the electronic NCCP Registration Form must be submitted to the Coaching Association of Canada as well as all other organizations as appropriate (e.g. Provincial/Territorial Coaching Coordinator or National Sport Federation).

## 6. FISU and University world championships

FCA's High Performance Committee decided that FISU is a development event, and as such, the following policy was approved:

**POLICY:** Those eligible archers must be Excellence members, achieving **Blue** squad criteria and meeting CIS eligibility guidelines. If there were more than 4 qualified archers, then standard team select policy would apply. Archers would be required to purchase their own uniforms and pay their own expenses.

### How can I get on the team?

The archers for this team will be chosen as follows:

**Three** FITA 1440 scores shot, between January 01, 2004 and June 24, 2005, will be averaged. A maximum of two of those scores can be from the year 2004. **One of the three scores must be from a major event.**

The average of the three scores must be equal to or greater than the 2004/2005 Blue Squad criteria for the appropriate gender and equipment category. The top four archers with the highest average in each equipment category will be named to the Canadian Team. If an archer is unable to attend, the next archer on the list will be selected, providing they meet the above criteria.

Please note that only two scores from 2004 can be used in the team selection average but archers do not have to use scores from 2004. **Two** scores from 2005 and **1** from 2004 **or** even **3** scores from 2005 could be used. The score from the major event can be from either year. Major events for team selection and ranking are listed on the FCA web site.

Archers must be members of Excellence 2008 by June 1<sup>st</sup>, 2005 to be members of this team. If archers were not members of the Excellence 2004 programme and wish to use scores from the year 2004, they must join Excellence 2008 and submit their year 2004 scores to the FCA office or Joan McDonald by June 01, 2005.

Scores must be submitted to Joan McDonald or the FCA by midnight **June 24, 2005**.

If you intend to try to make this team, please contact Kathy Millar right away. This will help us anticipate how many archers will be going and assist us with planning.

This study is a one-year follow-up to Raedeke, Granzky, and Warren's (2000) study on coach burnout from a commitment perspective and was designed to examine whether changes in the theoretical determinants of commitment related to changes in the exhaustion dimension of burnout and commitment level. For this study, 141 swim coaches completed a mail survey two-times one year apart that assessed commitment determinants (i.e., satisfaction, benefits, costs, investments, alternative options, and social constraints), feelings of exhaustion, and commitment. Based on static scores, results revealed that a majority (64 %) of coaches were assigned to the same commitment profile at Time 1 and Time 2. From a longitudinal perspective, cluster analysis revealed three coach profiles reflecting increasing attraction to coaching, increasing signs of entrapment, and decreasing coaching interest based on commitment model variables. Subsequent MANOVA results revealed a cluster by time interaction for both exhaustion and commitment. Coaches with characteristics suggesting increased entrapment showed the largest increase in exhaustion whereas those with decreased coaching interest had the lowest commitment.

Over the past 20 years, many theories on achievement motivation have been established to understand the complex interaction of motivational variables and identify the conditions that can enhance individuals' motivation. This review explores the role of conceptions of ability, its relations to other major motivational frameworks and factors affecting individuals' conceptions of ability, with the goal of identifying the major contributions to the research knowledge base. Research findings show that beliefs about the nature of ability are critical elements to all other major theories. **10. Team Coach for IPC Archery Championships**

The FCA is calling for the Team Coach to accompany the Canadian team to the IPC Archery Championships in Massa, ITA, September 24 to October 4, 2005. The team could be as large as 4 archers, male, compound and recurve. The criteria for selection of archers for this team can be seen on the FCA web site in the Excellence section.

The coach is responsible for creating a "team" of support staff and creating a productive and cohesive team out of the individual athletes. The coach will communicate with archers' personal coaches and each archer to determine how to best help the athlete perform at his/her best during the competition. The Coach is also responsible for overall on field management during the competition. Both bilingualism and coaching certification would be assets but are not mandatory.

The team budget will not be known until the FCA receives a response to its funding application to Sport Canada.
