#### **4. Blind Archery recognized by the International Paralympic Committee**

Archery is a sport in which all disabled people can express themselves, either standing or in a wheelchair, as well as visually impaired. In competition disabled archers are divided in classes according to their disability, so that like shoots against like. The material is the same as for able-bodied archers, with only slight modifications to make it easier for disabled people to practice this sport.

ST class consists of all archers who shoot from a standing position plus those who shoot from an ordinary chair with their feet on the ground. W2 class is for wheelchair users and W1 class is for wheelchair users with additional disabilities in their arms or hands. There is also an « open » class in which all disabled archers using a compound bow with flight hook, sight and magnifying lens (identical to able archers) are put together as paraplegic, amputated, etc.

Last week the 5th World IPC Archery Championship took place in Massa-Carrara, Italy with 184 archers from 31 countries participating (see [www.massacarrara2005.com](http://www.massacarrara2005.com)).

For the first time ten or so blind archers competed in a demonstration event hoping that blind archery would become a Paralympic discipline. A big step forward has been achieved with the International Paralympic Committee (IPC) deciding during its Congress held in Massa-Carrara to include blind archery in its future events. Blind archers use the same material as able archers, but it is the aiming technique that is different.

#### **5. Hydro-Québec Awards 22 Grants worth \$3000**

Last Tuesday, Hydro-Québec awarded 22 grants of \$3000 each to the most promising young Québec athletes, according to the funding framework for the 8<sup>th</sup> Programme de bourses Hydro-Québec. Administered by la Fondation de l'athlète d'excellence du Québec (FAEQ), this financial support programme allows selected athletes the opportunity to speed up their progression to the international scene.

### **9. Recreation Without Barriers**

Recreation can do wonders. Kids get far more from play than strong bodies. They gain inner strength-build self esteem, learn social skills, meet role models and develop good habits for life.

Everyone deserves that chance. But the promise of recreation is not always kept. Children in families with average or above average incomes are three times as likely to participate in organized sports as children in low-income families. They are also about one and half times more likely to take part in arts and cultural activities. There are many reasons kids can't play and they're not all financial - they may relate to cultural differences, family demands, inadequate transportation or a lack of facilities.

#### Mobilize your community

The Canadian Parks and Recreation Association has researched the issue, talked with recreation practitioners and other community stakeholders, and sponsored pilot projects across Canada. And we've developed an, easy-to-use Community Mobilization Tool Kit to help you open the doors to recreation and give every child the chance to participate.

### **10. Clubs, Judges and FCA Club Insurance for 2006**

In accordance with the FCA Operational Plan, starting in 2006, all clubs must include the name of at least one qualified club-level judge in order to receive liability insurance WHEN THEY SEND IN THEIR APPLICATION TO RE-AFFILIATE. Many clubs in Canada can meet this requirement already; some can not.

If your FCA club does not have a club-level judge already, the process is quite simple.

1. Use the club-level open-book test is available on-line, at no charge, on the FCA website.
2. Use the FCA rulebook on-line to complete the test.
3. Have the judge candidate send the test (field, target or 3D) to your provincial judge chair to be evaluated.

### **In Closing**

Information from Australian Institute of Sport and USA Archery  
Head Coach Ki Sik LEE leaves Archery Australia to USA Archery

Head Coach Ki Sik Lee has announced that he would be leaving the Australian Institute of Sport Archery Program on 17 December, 2005. He said his decision was based on a desire to seek new challenges within Archery. He will be heading to the USA Archery as its new National Head Coach as of 3 January, 2006.

The 48-year old South Korean was the Korean National Archery Champion in 1975 and 1979 and broke the national record 26 times during his shooting career. He served as the Korean National Men's Team Coach from 1981-1984 and again in 1990. He was the National Women's Team Coach from 1986-1989.

Mr. Lee was appointed Korean National Head Coach in 1991, a position he held until 1996. He was an Olympic Coach for Korea in 1984 and 1988 and was Head Coach of the Korean Olympic Team at 1992 Barcelona and 1996 Atlanta Olympic Games.

Mr. Lee was appointed Australian National Coach in 1997. He coached Sydney Olympic Gold Medalist, Simon Fairweather, and other members of the Australian team at the 2000 Games. He then coached the Australian team again in the 2004 Olympic Games in Athens, Greece, where Tim Cuddihy won a bronze medal and set an Olympic record score in the semi-finals.

Coach Lee's archers have won 23 medals in World Championships during the past 15 years. He has never taken a team to an Olympics and not returned with a medal. His athletes have won 9 of the 22 Olympic gold medals awarded in archery in the past 20 years.

Coach Lee has a bachelor's and master's degree in Physical Education. He has served as a director of shooting for major international events, as president, director and chairman of judges for the Korean Archery Association and has been a keynote speaker at many archery seminars around the world. He is also the author of a popular book entitled Total Archery.
