 - Work with archery PSOs to build a coach network and positive relationship with PSO coaches, club coaches and define how best the Regional Coach can fit into the existing PSO structure.
 - Work with certified and uncertified coaches within the region to share knowledge, mentor and monitor as needed
 - Work with affiliated and non-affiliated FCA clubs to disseminate information and develop club coach network
 - Will develop talent identification tools to link coaches and archers
 - Educate coaches and offer professional development seminars in the region & nationally
 - Teach use of and importance of athlete training plans
 - Liaise with PSO Learning Facilitators to bring new coaches into the network
 - Work with parents, schools, and outside agencies to promote coaching education and communication

7. FITA/IBU SkiArc

Ski Archery: Joint Agreement between FITA and IBU

Lausanne, Switzerland - As outcome of a meeting held near Torino, Italy on 15th April 2005, FITA and the International Biathlon Union (IBU) have prepared a joint agreement defining the future of ski archery (former archery biathlon) under the authority of FITA. This agreement was then officially ratified by the two International Federations Presidents Jim Easton and Anders Besserberg on 20th April in Berlin, Germany.

The main points of this agreement include:

- The return of the discipline of archery biathlon, as ski archery, from IBU to FITA with legal effect as of 1 April 2005.
- The continuation of the IBU/FITA cooperation in the areas of the use of venues and organization of competition, technical seminars and training of FITA Technical Delegates and Judges, information on calendar and results.
- The possibility given to athletes of IBU Member Federations to compete in ski archery without being formally included as Members of FITA Member Associations. They must, however, be entered or approved by a FITA Member Federation.

It is expected that the calendar for the season 2005-2006 will be finalized by the end of June 2005. In Torino the FITA representatives, Francesco Civarolo, Justyna Chmielewska and Françoise Dagouret, have also worked on the organization and development of the discipline in the near future.
