To all members of the Canadian Archery Association:

Another Canadian championship tournament has ended. The attached list of results will show that although the entry was disappointingly small, the caliber of the archers competing, was tops. Seven new Canadian records were established during the five days of shooting. Six perfect ends were shot. Thirteen 20's were shot during the field round. Several other near records were turned in.

The entertainment provided by the host club, the Edmonton Bow Hunters, like the shooting, was tops. All visiting archers will long remember a very active and enjoyable week in Edmonton. The Edmonton Bow Hunters are to be congratulated on their fine effort.

On Wednesday August 17th the Directors of the C.A.A. held their annual meeting. A perusal of the attached Minutes will indicate the sincere effort made by those present to find a solution for a number of problems facing the C.A.A. Two important recommendations were prepared by the meeting. The recommendation regarding C.A.A. trophies requires an explanation. For the past number of years the committee handling the championship tournament have been faced with the problem of rounding up trophies from the last year's winners. There has never been a presentation where all trophies have been on hand, - notwithstanding several letters and requests. Those trophies that do arrive in time are quite often broken and dirty, indicating that they have been in someone's basement since the last tournament. Very few are engraved with the previous winner's name, necessitating a search through last year's records. This year six trophies required repairs. Besides the inconvenience there is the cost of shipping trophies to both the C.A.A. and to the winner. For the above reasons the Directors felt it was in the best interest of the organization to suggest the following solution: "That for this year at least a professional photographer be engaged to take photographs of the champions with their trophies, such photos to be presented to the champions together with a suitable miniature keeping trophy, and that the C.A.A. trophies be engraved with the winner's name and retained by the C.A.A. in order that they will be available for shipment to the site of the next tournament."

A photographer was therefore engaged and after the presentations all champions were photographed with their trophies. These photographs will go forward together with the attached results. We are now in a position to get all trophies repaired and the engraving brought up to date.

All champions complied with the request of the Directors and left their trophies with the committee, with the exception of one archer who insisted upon removing their trophy. We only hope that this trophy will be made available when required.
